<p><b>Advanced Biology</b></p> <p><b>Grades:</b> 10-12 <b>Time:</b> 1:30-3:30</p> <p><b>Instructor:</b> Jodie Moore</p>	<p><b>Monthly Tuition:</b> \$40 <b>Material Fees:</b> \$0</p> <p><b>Text:</b> <u>Fearfully and Wonderfully Made</u> by Apologia &amp; Anatomy coloring book (may be purchased from the teacher)</p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> Successful completion of Biology</p> <p>Minimum: 5 students</p>	<p>This course is an awesome adventure for the high school student on the journey toward understanding the human body as God created it. It covers both the anatomy and the physiology of the human body's 11 organ systems. Projects and reports will be given to aid the students in research skills. There are three types of labs for this course. The first is microscope labs where we will examine specimens from the human body. The second is dissection labs, where we will dissect three specimens -a cow's eye, a cow's heart and a fetal pig. The third is coloring book exercises. These will aid in the memorization required in this course. It is not a juvenile coloring book. It is the same coloring book required in many university Human Anatomy classes. The text is organized into sixteen modules, each to be covered over a two-week period. Tests will be given following each module. These will be a combination of in class and take home tests. Take home tests should be monitored by the parent (not open-book). Students should expect to spend 3-4 hours per week on homework. The work load for this class is similar to Biology I. Combined with <i>Exploring Creation with Biology</i>, this course gives the student the equivalent of a university biology course. In other words, these two courses together cover the entire "advanced placement" (AP) curriculum. Upon completion of this course students should be able to take a CLEP placement exam and earn college credit.</p> <p><b>Please note:</b> the reproductive system is covered in detail, including frank (not pornographic) illustrations and descriptions.</p>

<p><b>Advanced High School English</b></p> <p><b>Grades:</b> 11-12 <b>Time:</b> 1:30</p> <p><b>Instructor:</b> Todd Speidell</p>	<p><b>Monthly Tuition:</b> \$25 <b>Material Fees:</b> \$0</p> <p><b>Texts:</b> Fyodor Dostoevsky, <i>The Adolescent</i> and <i>The Idiot</i> Flannery O'Connor, <i>Collected Works</i></p>	<p>This course is designed as an upper level English class for Juniors and Seniors who have successfully completed High School English A and are ready for challenging reading and writing assignments. Students will focus on composition and grammar while studying literature by reading Christian novelists Fyodor Dostoevsky and Flannery O'Connor (and writing research papers on these two writers). Students who do well in this course should be ready for college! (Books are available used at MacKay's or on Amazon—Dostoevsky's works are available as Kindle editions.)</p>
<p><b>Advanced Math</b></p> <p><b>Grades:</b> 10-12 <b>Time:</b> 11:00</p> <p><b>Instructor:</b> Jodie Moore</p>	<p><b>Monthly Tuition:</b> 1-2 students \$40 a month 3-5 students \$30 a month 6+ students \$20 a month</p> <p><b>Material Fees:</b> \$0</p> <p><b>Textbook required:</b> <u>Saxon Advanced math</u> 2<sup>nd</sup> edition. Optional but VERY helpful: solutions manual</p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> Successful completion of Algebra 1 and 2</p>	<p>This class is excellent preparation for the ACT and SAT as all the material on that test is covered in this text or has been covered in previous texts. This class continues building on Algebra 2 skills going through trigonometry and pre-calculus. It also finishes Geometry. This can be taken either before or after a standalone geometry class. Four – six lessons will be covered each week. Daily assignments are to be graded at home and recorded on an assignment sheet to be shown to the teacher weekly. Teacher will grade the quizzes and tests. A test will be sent home weekly with very few exceptions. These tests are to be completed without the use of the text. Workload is approximately 1 hour per day. A scientific calculator is required. A graphing calculator would be helpful as there are several lessons on its use in the text, but they will be optional due to the expense. This class is only one hour in duration because I expect that the students will already have a good grasp of the basic algebra concepts and we should have no trouble at all progressing through the material in one hour. I also expect that any student wishing to take this level of mathematics should be interested in learning and therefore prepared when they come to class. This allows much more time to be devoted to teaching and less to review of basic skills. For those who are required to take 4 years of math, this is the class that is needed to meet those requirements.</p> <p><b>Materials:</b> scientific calculator, three ring binder, compass, protractor, notebook paper, four divider tabs.</p>
<p><b>Algebra I - Saxon</b></p> <p><b>Grades:</b> 9-10 (advanced 8th graders) <b>Time:</b> 8:00-10:00</p> <p><b>Instructor:</b> Michelle Rosenbaum</p>	<p><b>Monthly Tuition:</b> \$30 <b>Materials fee:</b> \$5</p> <p><b>Text:</b> <u>Saxon Algebra 1</u> (4th Edition) and additional workbook</p>	<p>We will be using the newest edition of the Saxon Algebra 1 book, which covers topics typically covered in an Algebra 1 class. It does include some topics which the third edition did not cover at this level. The format and order of the lessons has been changed to better enhance student learning at all levels. We will utilize a mastery approach in an effort to truly grasp the topics as we progress throughout the year. There are 120 lessons, so we will cover an average of 4 lessons per week. There will be some take home tests (about 1 every 3 weeks) and quizzes. The teacher will grade the tests, quizzes, and selected problems, but the daily assignments are to be graded by the parent at home. Mastery of algebra involves going back over missed problems and learning how to do them correctly.</p>

<p><b>Algebra I - Jacobs</b></p> <p><b>Grades:</b> 9-10 (advanced 8th graders) <b>Time:</b> 10:00-12:00</p> <p><b>Instructor:</b> Michelle Rosenbaum</p>	<p><b>Monthly Tuition:</b> \$30 <b>Materials fee:</b> \$5</p> <p><b>Text:</b> <u>Elementary Algebra</u> by Harold Jacobs</p>	<p>In this class, we will cover topics typically covered in an Algebra 1 course. The author of the book uses a traditional approach and strongly emphasizes the current topic in the homework assignments and includes review of previously covered concepts. Students will be encouraged to master the material in an effort to lay a solid foundation for future math courses. We will cover an average of 4 lessons per week. There will be some take home tests (about 1 every 3 weeks) and quizzes. The teacher will grade the tests, quizzes, and selected problems, but the daily assignments are to be graded by the parent at home. Mastery of algebra involves going back over missed problems and learning how to do them correctly. <b>Supplies:</b> Scientific calculator, binder, 4 dividers, paper &amp; graph paper</p>

This course covers typical Algebra 2 topics and includes a strong focus on advanced math topics. There are 120 lessons, so we will cover an average of 4 lessons per week. There will be some take home tests (about 1 every 3 weeks) and quizzes. The teacher will grade the tests, quizzes, and select problems, but the daily assignments are to be graded by the parent at home. A mastery approach is utilized. It is a foundational class for high school Government/Economics. We will learn about types of governments and compare them to our American democracy, learn about the constitution and bill of rights and essential elements of citizenship. Some basic U. S. geography will be covered in this section. Then we will have an introduction to economics learning about such terms as supply and demand and competition then understand the differences between communism and free enterprise. This is not just a textbook course but will use several class activities throughout the year so students can gain a firsthand understanding of these concepts and how our government and economy affect their everyday lives. A small amount of reading will be done at home and during class, we will discuss the reading and do class activities. Such calamities as the assassination of Abraham Lincoln, the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, the horrible sufferings of the Donner party in the Sierra Nevadas, the Titanic, the San Francisco earthquake and our losses on 9/11 will be explored. We will look at how these events impacted our nation, how we responded and overcame them and prepared never to permit them to recur. We will study art appreciation techniques, while connecting the art to the science, history, and social customs of the particular time and place. The emphasis will be on Western art of the Americas and Europe, but the influence of other parts of the world will be introduced. Students will also learn about the symbols used in Christian art. The class is designed to satisfy the fine art requirement for high school, so students will spend approximately 30 to 45 minutes per day on homework. This course will study God's Word as an historical-literary document in accordance with standard canons of interpretation. Furthermore, and most importantly, the Bible is a theological document, recording and testifying to God's acts and words in our world. As such, this course will emphasize a theological reading of Scripture, especially hearing its witness to God's word and work in Jesus Christ for us and for our salvation. Assignments will focus on careful reading, disciplined writing, and theological interpretation of Scripture. Science knowledge is important but being able to think and reason with that knowledge is necessary for success in upper level science. ACT tests do not test knowledge, they test scientific reasoning. This course is a textbook science for those in grades 6-8 that takes scientific knowledge and teaches the student to reason through the scientific process. This text uses the Inquiry approach. With the inquiry approach and interactive nature, students will be motivated and they will accept that science is relevant and interesting. The books also challenge students to think creatively and critically. The text is part of the Singapore curriculum. Why Singapore? This country is top in the world in both math and science. If we want to be the top, then we can learn from how they teach their children We will cover topics as follows: Science as an Inquiry, Attitudes in Science, Process or Methods in Science, Products of Science, Science and Technology in Society its uses and abuses, measurement, Classification of Matter, Elements, Compounds and Mixtures, Separation Techniques, Solutions and Suspensions, Classifications of Plant and Animal Life, models and systems, cells - Structure, Function and Organization, Particulate Model of Matter, simple Concepts of Atoms and Molecules, Transport in Living Things, Digestion in Animals. State curriculum guidelines will be covered in this 5<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade class. Older students will have more extensive assignments to meet guideline requirements. Resources will include <u>Exploring Tennessee</u> by Notgrass, Tennessee History for Kids website, books from the Tennessee State Library and the East TN Historical Society Museum, and any applicable library materials. The class will use resources offered by the East TN Historical Society for group instruction both in our classroom and at the museum in downtown Knoxville (most likely once a semester). Students will create a notebook to keep, with entries from history (Native Americans until present), famous Tennesseans, state geography, civics, and just plain “fun” information. My desire is to also get groups together for field trips to historical sites (not on Thursdays).</p>

Books are carefully selected from a wide range of recommended literature and will be rotated on a two year basis to accommodate those taking this class two years (last year’s course was described as grades 3-4). <b>It is through reading, dissecting, and analyzing good writing that students begin to find how it fits into their world of expression.</b> Writing skills introduced are through the nationally recognized 6+1 Writing Traits program by Ruth Culham. These skills gently move students through ideas, organization, voice, sentence fluency, word choice, conventions, and presentation to gain more confidence in putting thoughts on paper. Structure of writing is presented and encouraged at this stage in order for the writer to feel safe in the way he/she expresses. This program has proven to be a great resource for encouraging the independent, creative writer. Book lists will be provided as well as information for parents about the 6+1 program.  <b><i>In addition this year, this class will partner with a private international school located in Prague in the Czech Republic for a pen pal program. The class of third graders there are from at least nine different countries. This will be a great writing motivator and international connection!!</i></b></p>

This class will use the 6+1 Writing Traits program by Ruth Culham as does Creative Writing A (read about that above), but with different standards and self-evaluation. Skills are presented in mini-lessons and practiced in writing using good literature as a stimulus. <b>Once again, in order to write well, students must be guided in analyzing good writing in the books they read.</b> We do this by character analysis, compare/contrast, plot analysis, story mapping, graphic organizers, oral reading, and searches for literary devices. Books we read are carefully selected and lean towards Newbery Award and Honor books. At this level, students love to read books about events that affect their lives and then respond with their thoughts and opinions. These books will alternate on a two year basis to allow for students wishing to take the class two years (last year's course was described as grades 5-6). Book lists will be provided along with materials for parents about the 6+1 writing program.</i></p>

Students must be able to write an essay or creative writing piece that displays some understanding of writing traits of ideas, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, conventions, and presentation as discussed in 6+1 Writing Traits.
